IT IS HEREBY ORDERED THAT:

1. The petition of Keith Ellison, in his official capacity as Attorney General, Office of the Attorney General for further review of the decision of the Court of Appeals be, and the same is, granted. The petitioners shall proceed as the appellants, and briefs shall be served and filed in the quantity, form and within the time limitations contained in Minn. R. Civ. App. P. 131 and 132. Counsel will be notified later of the date and time for argument before this court.

2. The motion of the Minnesota Association for Justice, the Minnesota Defense Lawyers Association, and the Minnesota State Bar Association to serve and file a joint brief as amici curiae in the above-entitled matter in support of petitioners be, and the same is, granted.

3. The motion of the League of Minnesota Cities, the Association of Minnesota Counties, and the Minnesota County Attorneys Association to serve and file a joint brief as amici curiae in the above-entitled matter in support of petitioners be, and the same is, granted.


4. The motion of the District of Columbia to serve and file a brief as amicus curiae in the above-entitled matter in support of petitioners be, and the same is, granted. Any state that wishes to join in the District of Columbia's amicus brief must do so on or before that brief is filed and must be identified as a joint amicus on the brief.

5. The motion of the National Association of Manufacturers to serve and file a brief as amicus curiae, in support of neither party, in the above-entitled matter be, and the same is, granted.

6. The briefs of amici shall be served and filed in accordance with Minn. R. Civ. App. P. 129 and 132.01. Amici will not be permitted to participate in oral argument.
