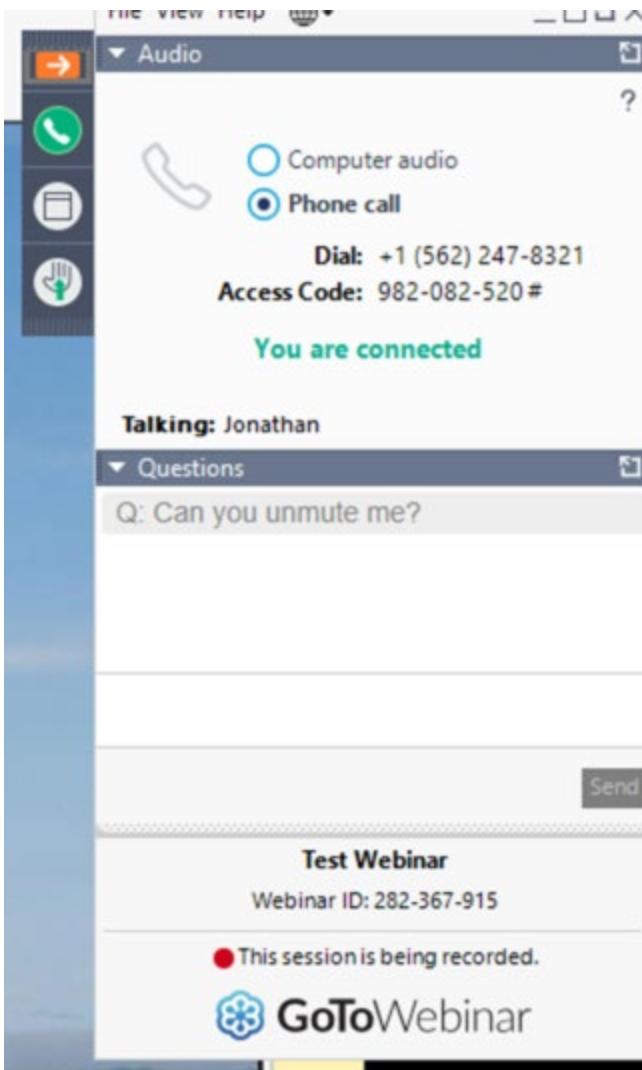

Dear Colleague,

Pat Parenteau and I are writing to invite you to participate in an invitation-only webinar to discuss the status of nuisance lawsuits filed against oil companies for climate change-related damages. There is significant media, public, and student interest in the lawsuits and we thought you might find the opportunity to learn more about them helpful.

The webinar will include the lead lawyers for several of the suits, who will discuss the novel legal theories behind the cases, why they are different from earlier attempts to hold fossil fuel companies accountable for climate change damages, what's next in the process, and how the industry and its many surrogates are attacking the cases and the communities. We have both heard the lawyers discuss the cases and have found them very informative and interesting. There are a number of reasons why these cases appear to stand a much better chance of success than the earlier round of nuisance lawsuits that were all dismissed. The lawyers will discuss in detail the bases for the cases.

To remind you of the background, in July 2017, three California coastal communities – Marin County, San Mateo County, and the City of Imperial Beach – filed lawsuits in state court against 36 of the largest oil, gas, and coal companies in the world. San Francisco and Oakland filed similar lawsuits in September. Santa Cruz County, New York City, and the cities of Santa Cruz and Richmond subsequently followed did as well. Boulder City and County and San Miguel County have now also joined in suing the oil companies.

While there are differences among the cases, they share a common theme: holding fossil fuel companies accountable for costs and damages they are incurring to plan for, mitigate, and adapt to rising seas and other consequences of climate change.

Yet, for the time being at least, the cases are proceeding on separate tracks: while all of the California cases were filed in state court raising only state common law claims, they were removed by defendants to federal court. US District Judge William Alsup recently rejected a remand motion saying the San Francisco and Oakland cases belong in federal court under federal common law. However, US District Judge Vincent Chhabria subsequently ordered the Marin, San Mateo, and Imperial Beach cases back to state court because, he said, federal common law does not apply.

Meanwhile, Exxon has launched a counterattack by threatening a lawsuit in Texas raising allegations of potential bond fraud against several of the cities and counties who dared to sue them in California.

The webinar, which Pat Parenteau and I are co-hosting, should be informative and interesting and address a number of important issues. You will also have an opportunity to ask questions of the lawyers.
